

Oxford Royale Academy takes its responsibility to safeguard and support its students very seriously.

The safety and security of our students is our top priority. All of the venues at which our courses run are safe, secure environments, which are perfect for our students. The accommodation sites are staffed 24 hours a day, 7 days a week by Oxford Royale Academy's comprehensively trained team of campus staff, which is always on hand.

Students are overseen on campus by the **Programme Director**, who implements the day-to-day running of the programme. The Programme Director is supported by a team consisting of the **Assistant Programme Director**, Junior Deans, Counsellors, Matrons, and Teachers.

The Junior Deans and Counsellors ensure that students are looked after pastorally, culturally and socially during their programme.

Counsellors supervise students on excursions and during breaktimes, and students are able to talk frankly to the Counsellors about any issues which may arise.

Matrons, who are residential on campus, provide pastoral care and supervision, including the administration of any medicines, helping students with their laundry and supervising students outside of lesson times.

Teachers are responsible for their students during lessons, but are also available at weekends for more informal discussions.

COURSE OPTIONS

Each course lasts for one-week, although many students elect to combine courses and stay for a number of consecutive weeks.




Our younger students get a head start on the road to educational success.

Academic Discovery for ages 8-10

St Mary's School, Ascot

Our Academic Discovery programme offers students aged 8-10 the opportunity to study a key question in detail over each week-long session, and explore a theme from a variety of STEM, Humanities and Arts perspectives.

Students on this course will be provided with a diverse range of exciting, practical learning experiences which will ensure full engagement with and enjoyment of the course. This programme aims to increase students' enthusiasm for STEM, Arts and Humanities and allows them to share this with other students on the course.

Academic content

Each week, students explore a topic through scientific and arts-based lenses, leading to a wider investigation of the subject. Examples of topics are:

- 185 Days in Space: a poet's dream or a zero-gravity nightmare?; Students will examine a range of questions related to space, such as "What enables a soft landing?" and "What is space food like?".
- Rise of the Robots: a threat or a service to humankind?; Students will examine a range of robot-related ancillary questions, such as "How have robots changed the way jobs are carried out?" and "How have robots captured our imaginations in literature?".
- Extreme Earth: can humans stop natural disasters?; Participants will investigate some of the most extreme environments on the planet, and what humans do to help manage their impact on society.

Academic Discovery Plus for ages 11-12

St Mary's School, Ascot

The Academic Discovery Plus programme for ages 11-12 offers students the opportunity to live and study in a top UK boarding school as they investigate themed questions in an engaging way.

When enrolling, each student will be asked to choose either the Arts or STEM stream of the course, and this choice will decide which key question they will investigate for the week. Lessons will involve pitched debates, and all students will conclude their course with an assessed presentation.

Academic content

Students can follow the programme for between one and five weeks, nominating a stream each week. Different key questions will be available in each week, such as:

- Designing a better world: Can technology and engineering alone help us to achieve 'sustainable cities?'; During the course, students will examine a range of city-related big questions, such as "How polluted are our cities?" and "Is solar power economically viable in developing countries?".
- Stranded! What skills would enable you to survive on a remote Indian Ocean island?; Students will work out what skills and tools are essential in survival situations, and look at historical examples of odds-defying survivors of fact and fiction, such as Robinson Crusoe.
- From scene to screen: how is the way we experience 'The Arts' changing over time?; During the course, students will compare classic literature to film adaptations, investigate the use of narrative in modern advertising, and ways in which technology is changing how we experience traditional art forms.

Game Creation for ages 8-12







St Mary's School, Ascot

Game Creation for ages 8-10 is designed to introduce our youngest students to the world of computer game coding, providing them with practical experience and enabling them to develop transferable skills that will help them in their future educational endeavours.

In the course of producing two functioning games, students will gain an appreciation of how to plan and manage a small game coding project. This will be a useful transferable skill for school projects, and beyond.

Academic content


Participants on this course will create games using an engine called Construct 2. A powerful engine, yet considered perfect for beginners, Construct 2 is based on HTML5. Instead of typing out code, students will use Construct 2's block-based, drag and drop interface, which allows them to bring their ideas to life much more quickly. Construct 2 also allows students to add sound and graphics to their games, and make exciting things happen using behaviours and events.

Students will first learn about the building blocks of video games, including graphics, actions and events. Participants will then move on to making their own 'Space Defense' themed game - they will get to determine how a character is controlled, and how the enemies in the game behave. Characters will need animations. Special effects will need to be added. Imaginations can run wild!

As part of their assessment for the course, students will present their game to their peers in the class.

Coding with Scratch for ages 8-12

St Mary's School, Ascot

The Coding with Scratch course for ages 8-12 from Oxford Royale Academy is designed to introduce students to the exciting world of coding, in a fun and engaging way. During an exciting week, students will learn how to write code, and will then apply their new skills to a variety of projects, including navigating a robot through a maze and building a basic platform game.

This course is "hands-on" from day one - students will immediately get the chance to start coding, as this is the best way for young learners to engage with coding and computer science. Students will create three computer programs, and will then move on to programming and controlling their robotic ball.

Academic content

Participants on this course will start by creating a quiz game using a basic Scratch program.

Students will then move on to learning intermediate Scratch skills, covering such items as sprites and animation. The course will then progress to advanced Scratch skills, and some final tips and tricks for mastering Scratch.

The final day of the course will be devoted to bringing the students' code into the real world, through the programming of a Sphero robotic ball.











Junior English Programme for ages 8-12

St Mary's School, Ascot



The Junior English Programme is aimed at students who want to improve their English, and who might be considering studying in the UK in the future.

Students have the option to spend between one and five weeks improving their spoken and written English language skills on this inspiring summer programme, living and studying in a fully immersive environment.

Academic content

Running throughout July and August, each study week of the Junior English Programme consists of 16 hours of classroom teaching, which will be delivered in a variety of styles to ensure students remain interested and engaged.

In addition to improving reading and writing skills, classes will hone students' mastery of English grammar, vocabulary, pronunciation, listening, and syntax. The Junior English Programme will expand students' confidence and awareness beyond what they may have learned at school, and our EFL teachers use dynamic, interactive, and fun student-centred teaching methods. Student learning is maximised in small class sizes, usually not more than 12 students, and the programme is integrated with cultural activities and excursions outside of the classroom to provide ample opportunity for practical language application.

Business Discovery Plus for ages 11-12

St Mary's School, Ascot

Oxford Royale Academy's Business Discovery Plus programme introduces students aged 11-12 to the basic principles of business from an academic perspective and all the relevant aspects of business and marketing.

Students on this course hone their public speaking and business English skills, while learning how to defend their case in a debate and operate in a team. They will explore how to handle life as an entrepreneur, and gain the confidence to follow their own innovative ideas through to fruition, which is a valuable life skill in any business sector they go into in later life.

Academic content

On this one week intensive course, students will learn about the aims and objectives of companies and why they operate the way they do. They will also cover topics such as consumer needs versus wants, the costs and risks of starting a business, and explore modern marketing techniques. Relevant examples of famous products will be explored to discover how they have been successful. Students will then delve into the exciting challenge of creating a product idea of their own.

Students will develop their product idea from design to point of sale. In teams, and with the guidance of Oxford Royale Academy's outstanding teaching staff, they will examine their product from a variety of angles - such as start-up costs, marketing strategy, supply chain logistics, and disaster scenarios. At the end of the week, students will present their product at a Dragon's Den-style product launch, where other groups will act as the Dragons and ask them to defend their product and the methodology of their business.





KEY STATISTICS





New Perspectives is an established academic summer course for students aged 13-15. Students on this course have the opportunity to live and study in colleges of the universities of Oxford or Cambridge (the top two universities in the world), or at the historic Yarnton Manor, and follow subjects of their own choice.

New Perspectives offers students the opportunity to focus on subjects they are already interested in, or to learn something completely new. The course provides a selection of subjects that may eventually be studied at a higher level.

Academic content

University of Cambridge

Each week, students receive more than 20 hours of teaching, under the guidance of members of Oxford Royale Academy's world-class faculty. For each two-week session students choose two morning subjects and one workshop class from 17 possible options, and follow all of their classes for two weeks.

Oxford Summer English

University of Oxford



Oxford Summer English is a residential English language programme for students aged 13-15. While immersed in one of the UK's most culturally rich cities, students participate in an intensive programme of classes,

workshops, excursions and social events.

This two or four-week programme encourages students to learn English and develop their ability to communicate with people from different cultures and countries. Oxford Royale Academy promotes a coherent and multi-cultural approach to English language learning, actively expanding students' abilities and encouraging them to share ideas.

Academic content

Reading, writing, speaking and listening are all targeted by our syllabus, and students work on their abilities in these areas through our interactive teaching style. Participants actively improve their English through studentcentred activities which are original, exciting and challenging.

This course provides a unique educational environment in which students are immersed in the English language alongside like-minded students. It also introduces them to life in the UK, giving them a flavour of English as used in its natural context, which accelerates learning and deepens the cultural appreciation of this complex language.

Film Academy

University of Oxford

Our Film Academy course for students aged 13-15 is a twoweek extensive HD digital video production course, during which students learn the various techniques required to make video for television and film.

Students following Oxford Royale Academy's Film Academy programme will live and study in the historic city of Oxford, providing them with a unique opportunity to discover the atmosphere and architecture of its world-renowned university buildings.

Film Academy introduces students to the processes involved in planning, storyboarding, scriptwriting, and then shooting and editing a short film.

Academic content

The programme is very much 'hands on'; from day one, students get to use high definition digital video cameras and learn from established industry professionals with a passion for crafting moving images.

The first part of the process is to learn the basics of production – planning, script writing and development, location scouting, and storyboarding. Once students are ready to start filming, they work in small groups using the latest HD video cameras, professional microphones and lighting equipment to shoot their production on location. Once the film is 'in the can' students use the latest Apple Macs and Final Cut Pro to edit their masterpiece. Credits and titles complete the production, followed by mastering for the students' own portfolios and for publishing on the internet.

Academic content

During two weeks of captivating study, students enrolled on our Introduction to Engineering course benefit from 20+ hours of teaching per week. The course addresses the different aspects of engineering from a practical perspective, enabling students to assess whether it would be a suitable future study option or career. Participants on this course gain the technical and analytical skills that are vital for engineering. Through presentations and practical group-based activities, they hone transferable skills such as communication and public speaking, and have the chance to grow more confident in conveying their ideas, gaining the tools and vocabulary to discuss the technical topics and new concepts covered within the course.



Our Introduction to Law programme is ideal for students considering future studies or a career in law. The course gives students an understanding of the way law works within society, as well as introducing legal theory, key principles and case law.

During two weeks of interactive study and discussion, students on the course will look at a variety of different fields within the discipline. A group project will enable participants to develop key skills for success in this highly competitive area, and students will also be given an early insight into life as a law student at university or college. The overall aim of this new programme is to provide participants with an initial advantage as they start their journey towards becoming a legal professional.

Academic content

Students on this course will be introduced to a number of legal disciplines including jurisprudence, constitutional law, criminal law, tort law and other areas besides. They will also explore the skills and tasks most required of multiple legal professions, in order to assess whether they themselves would be suited to such a career in the future. The course promotes an interactive and engaging approach, using classroom debates, group tasks, and role-play exercises to engage students all aspects of the legal landscape and their impact on society. Our Introduction to Law students also have the chance to observe a real criminal trial at Oxford Magistrates' Court, as well as participate in a mock classroom-based trial of their own.

Transferable skills such as presenting, communicating and teamwork will also be developed.

Academic content

Introduction to Medicine provides an insight into the challenging and exciting world of studying medicine, and gives students the chance to assess whether they would like to study medicine at undergraduate level in the future. Students on this course benefit from the expertise of our teaching faculty, as all teachers on this course will be qualified doctors or advanced students of medicine.

Introduction to Architecture

Based in the architecturally-impressive city of Oxford, our Introduction to Architecture course is designed to expand the students' general knowledge of architecture in an enjoyable and interactive environment.

This two-week course aims to help students decide whether or not architecture is a subject they might want to pursue at university and as a career. Looking at what it takes to study architecture at a higher level and thinking about long-term study plans at an early stage in their education is helpful, as it means students can tailor their subject choices over several years to give them the best chance of a successful university or college application.

Academic content

Students on this fascinating course will be introduced to the principles of architecture and given a grounding in the history of architecture in Europe. Participants will learn about numerous aspects of architecture, including the principles of design and space planning. Students will also learn about concerns such as planning law and building control regulations, and gain practical skills in project design by trying their hand at architectural drawing and constructing manual and digital architectural models. They will gain an understanding of what being an architect involves, including how architecture interacts with construction and engineering, giving an insight into possible future career paths. At the end of the course, students will work on a design portfolio competition in a team with other students.

ORA's Introduction to Web Coding course provides a broad foundation in computer programming, web design and development, teaching students how to build great websites. It is a hands-on introduction to all of the essential tools and skills you'll need to build websites. Students will learn what it means to be a front-end, back-end or full-stack developer, and will be equipped with the skills to develop a website from scratch.

Academic content

The course is dedicated to teaching students about the Hyper Text Mark-up Language (HTML), a programming language that forms the backbone of any web page; Cascading Style Sheets (CSS), which is used to set style rules and appearances of web pages; and Javascript, a scripting language that is used to add functionality and interactivity. All these tools are required to design and develop modern websites.



Introduction to Fashion and Textile Design

Our Introduction to Fashion and Textile Design course provides students with a fascinating first glimpse into a rewarding, creative and increasingly high-profile career option.

Participants on this course spend their days in Oxford creating all manner of interesting print designs, before using those designs in fashion illustrations and a full-size fashion project. The hands-on design experience of the course, coupled with its grounding in theory will not only distinguish students from their peers, but also give them a strong foundation which they can build from in the future.

Academic content

This course combines theoretical and practical elements of fashion and design, ranging from the history of design to analysis of key pieces and how they reflected the eras in which they were produced. Lessons will concentrate on the building blocks of fashion such as fashion illustration and silhouette design and contextualise their learning by studying influential designers.

Students will go over core theories in design such as: technical drawing techniques and terms such as cross-hatching and 3D effects; how mixed media, surfaces and textures are used to create desired effects; colour theory, and how displays in shops and museums follow certain curation rules.

Academic content

Cutting-edge robots are taking the world by storm. Whether designed to complete simple, repetitive tasks or highly complex operations, robots look set to transform almost every aspect of our lives.

Participants will become familiar with Raspberry Pi and will write code in Python; however, prior knowledge of Raspberry Pi or Python is not a pre-requisite.

In addition to the practical element, students will also take time out to analyse the field of robotics as it stands today, which will include a debate on self-driving cars.



They will extend their vocabulary, grammar and syntax, and work on reading, writing and listening skills through discussing a variety of world topics in English. Students will improve their conversational English as well as working on their formal English skills for use in the workplace or in academic contexts.

Global Business, Management and Finance

University of Oxford

This fascinating course enhances students' critical business, management and financial knowledge through the exploration of cutting-edge theory and the application of relevant, powerful and captivating case studies.

Work in the classroom will be supported with field trips, designed to give students an insight into the real-world applications of the theory studied in lessons. Previous field trips have included a tour of a Jaguar Land Rover plant and a visit to the London Stock Exchange.

Academic content

This course is designed for any student who wishes to be successful in the global business world of today. Participants on this course will examine topics including leadership within organisations, and organisational behavior. They will focus on the glue that sticks a business organisation together – human capital and human resource management. Students cover the evolution of management theory and focus on the changes that have occurred in management prior to and during the twenty-first century. Participants will then focus on the need for businesses to be dynamic and agile through strategic management and innovation. Students will have plenty of opportunities to ask questions of their teacher, and to discuss particular areas of interest with them and with their peers.

International Law in the 21st Century

University of Oxford

This course is aimed at gap year students and current undergraduates who wish to expand their understanding of law with like-minded peers from all over the world.

This two-week course is aimed at students aged 19-25 who are keen to learn the fundamentals of modern international law. Prior legal training is not required, as all the necessary concepts will be covered in this intensive course. Students will be taught public and private law from both a UK and an international perspective, aiming to provide them with solid foundations in the international law discipline.

Academic content

The course will focus on recent developments in the field of international law, and guide students through the central debates within the discipline. It begins with the philosophy of law, seeking to help students understand the origin of legal systems and grasp legal thinking. It then covers the main theories of international law, drawing from realism to liberal institutionalism and constructivism. During the two weeks, students will have plenty of opportunity to apply their newly acquired knowledge, in model UN debates, mock trials and a visit to a court of Law in either Oxford or London.

International **Medical Research** and Practice

University of Oxford

Our International Medical Research and Practice course focuses on the factors that affect human health, and the development of cutting-edge medicines, treatments and vaccines.

Students on this course will study and learn in a variety of ways. They will complete written work as well as take part in group debates, role plays and presentations. Through these, students will develop a range of skills – such as public speaking, team work and academic writing - that will stand them in good stead at university and in their future careers.

Academic content

During the course, students will have the opportunity to carry out their own labbased experiments and submit a lab report, tasks that will be expected of them at university. Students will receive guidance on how to interpret scientific papers in top medical journals, as well as assistance in producing a review article on a topic of their choice. The course will also provide students with assistance in preparing for further study in the UK or abroad through CV and interview skills workshops.













iOS App Programming and Web Development

University of Oxford

The iOS App Programming and Web Development course is a unique and highly relevant programme designed for gap year students, undergraduates and others who wish to learn how to construct cutting-edge smartphone apps and websites.

The course will provide students with a deeper understanding of technologies that have become a fundamental part of daily life. Students will leave the course equipped with new knowledge and skills that have the potential to lead to a lucrative career or to supercharge their own start-up business.

Academic content

The course will focus first on iOS Application Programming. It is dedicated to teaching Swift programming, which is the new, powerful language for iOS. Students will be introduced to the principles that govern the Internet, to help them better understand how to use them for Web Development. They will learn HTML5 which will allow them to create their own website, as well as CSS, the styling language for the Web, allowing them to add style to their websites. They will then be introduced to JavaScript, which is one of the scripting languages for website interactivity, enabling them to bring their websites to life.

Politics and International Relations: a Global Perspective

University of Oxford

This two-week summer course combines politics and international relations with the study of successful leadership, to give students a firm grounding in the principles of contemporary leadership.

No prior experience or study of politics is required; the only pre-requisites are an interest in the different systems of government around the world, and the desire to improve one's own leadership skills. A key aim of the course is to train students to be able to apply academic skills to political problems, therein preparing them for a career in political consultancy and policy development.

Academic content

Why have some countries developed stable state institutions, while others have degenerated into failed states? What explains regime change and regime stability? Many of the most pressing global challenges are inherently political in nature. This course provides students with a theoretical and methodological toolkit to allow them to engage with political questions such as these.













Psychological and Behavioural Science

University of Oxford

What makes you, 'you'? What governs the way you behave, and the way other people behave towards you? The answers aren't always as clear as one might think, and our Psychological and Behavioural Science course for 19-25 year-olds will shed light on the complex workings of the human mind.

This course will introduce students to a range of theories and how they attempt to explain human behaviour. The topics covered will help students to better understand the behaviour of others and of themselves, and students will also explore some of the psychological conditions that may afflict individuals and require treatment.

Academic content

This summer course is designed to give students an overview of the topic areas studied in Psychology: Developmental Psychology, Abnormal Psychology, The Study of the Brain, and Personality Types in Psychology. A strong focus upon Cognitive (Working Memory) Psychology will be retained throughout the course.

The course also explores the historical and contemporary importance that Psychology holds as a discipline within humankind's development of explanations for the world around them. Class excursions to sites such as Bedlam and the Freud Museum in London will provide a critical socio-historical angle to the course.

Public Speaking Skills for the Modern World and Workplace

University of Oxford

This two-week course is the perfect programme for anyone seeking to improve their abilities in delivering a speech or presentation to an audience.

The course combines study of the theories and methodologies behind successful speeches with practical exercises and drills. Through these, students on the course will become adept at planning and delivering first-class speeches.

Academic content

The first week of the course will be introductory in nature. Students will explore the skills required to be a great public speaker, look at contemporary and historical case studies, and cover many more fundamentals of the discipline.

In week two, students will explore the delivery of a public speech, enabling them to put their classroom learning into practice. Topics covered in the second week include managing audience reactions, the use of visual aids, and the importance of preparation in answering questions.


